Fee Statues / Annotations

Membership fee assessment

Reduction in membership fee for new members taking out a two-year membership

New members have the chance to benefit from a special rule if they initially register for a two-year membership period. In such case, the membership fee will be reduced by 30% for the first year, and by 15% for the second year. After the second year the member will be required to pay the full membership fee. This offer is valid only for new members and can only be used once.



Membership categories are assigned and defined as follows:

Law firms

Any private law firm is eligible for membership in ELTA. The membership fee shall be determined by the number of the law firm's employees. Because membership in ELTA is by entity, any employee of the law firm, including any of its branch offices, may participate in ELTA activities at no additional cost.

Law departments

Any corporate, governmental or judicial law department is eligible for membership in ELTA. The membership fee shall be determined by the number of employees in the legal department. Because membership in ELTA is by entity, any lawyer in the legal department, including any of its branch offices, may participate in ELTA activities at no additional cost. Law departments benefit from a special offer: the first year of membership is free.

Vendors & Start-ups

Any legal tech vendor or start-up is eligible for membership in ELTA. The membership fee shall be determined by the number of the firm's employees. Because membership in ELTA is by entity, anyone employed by the firm, including any of its branch offices, may participate in ELTA activities at no additional cost.

Scientific, academic and public institutions

Any scientific, academic and public institution is eligible for membership in ELTA. There is a general membership fee for those institutions.

Individual members

Individuals can be accepted as individual members if their activities, their occupation and/or their involvement in commercial life are suitable for promoting the Association's objectives. Students and trainee lawyers need to provide an annual confirmation of their status to continue their membership as students or trainee lawyers. If not provided the member's status will be transferred to that of a regular individual member.

Billing

Each January, members will be billed for annual membership dues. If members join the ELTA during the year, the annual membership fee will be reduced accordingly:

Registration at the end of Q1: Membership fee covering Q2-Q4 of the present year will be due upon admission as member

Registration at the end of Q2 => Membership fee covering Q3-Q4 of the present year will be due upon admission as member

Registration at the end of Q3 => Membership fee covering Q4 of the present year will be due upon admission as member

Registration at the end of Q4 => Membership fee covering Q1-Q4 of the coming year will be due upon admission as members

Cancellation of membership

By members

Membership may be cancelled upon written notice to the Board, such notice to be provided not later than the 30 September in any calendar year. (see ELTA Statue, § 4 Membership)

In the case of individuals, membership shall expire as a result of death, while in the case of legal entities or groups of legal entities it shall expire upon the dissolution of the legal entity.

By ELTA's Board

The Board may exclude a member if such member violates the provisions of this Charter. In particular; if such member fails to comply with the obligation to pay a membership fee; if insolvency proceedings are instituted against the member's assets in accordance with the insolvency code or the institution of such proceedings was rejected on grounds of insufficient assets; or if the member in question grossly violates the Association's reputation. Before being excluded, the member must be given an opportunity to make a statement. The exclusion shall take effect when the member concerned receives the Board's decision on the exclusion.
